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


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

ABSTRACT

Key words: YouTube videos, speaking skill, asking for and giving opinions and thoughts.

The objective of this research was to find out whether using YouTube videos of "Asking and Giving Opinions or Thoughts" has a significant effect on students' speaking skills.

A pre-experimental design employing a one-group pretest – post-test group design was utilized as the research method. The population of this study were eleventh-grade students from MAN Kota Palangka Raya. XI MIPA 1 was chosen as the experimental group using cluster random sampling, while XI MIPA 2 was chosen as the tryout group. Speaking skills were evaluated with a pretest and post-test. Data analysis was conducted using the Wilcoxon non-parametric test due to the non-normal distribution of the data. Additionally, a questionnaire was utilized as secondary data to supplement the statistical findings in this research.

Based on the results of the Wilcoxon non-parametric test, if the Asymp. Sig. (2-tailed) value is less than sig. 0,05 (Asymp. Sig. (2-tailed) < 0,05), then the alternative hypothesis (Ha) can be accepted while rejecting the null hypothesis (Ho). In this case, the Asymp. Sig. (2-tailed) value was found to be 0,001. Comparing this value to the probability value of 0,05, it means that $0,001 < 0,05$, indicating that the **alternative hypothesis (Ha) is accepted** and the null hypothesis (Ho) is rejected. It was also supported by the results of the questionnaire, which showed that the students' responses fell into the "agree" category for 4 questions and the "strongly agree" category for 6 other questions after being analyzed by using the % index formula and the percentage of questionnaire scores in Table 4.5. It can be concluded that YouTube videos of “asking for and giving opinions and thoughts” have a significant effect on students’ speaking skills in the eleventh grade at MAN Kota Palangka Raya in the academic year 2022-2023.

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
